

National Children & Youth Garden Symposium Residence Hall Accommodations: July 10-13, 2019

Reservations are being taken for accommodations in <u>Sellery Hall</u>, a University residence hall located at 821 W. Johnson Street, Madison, WI 53706. Rooms are available either as double or single occupancy, all with single/twin beds. Maximum occupancy is 2 persons per room. Sellery Hall will be open to receive guests beginning Wednesday, July 10 at 12:00 p.m. and will be available until Saturday, July 13.

Sleeping Accommodations and Amenities:

- Bed linens, pillows, towels, washcloths, drinking cups, and soap are furnished.
- Free high-speed (wired and wireless) Internet and digital TV connections are available in the guest rooms for your electronic devices. Please bring any necessary connecting cables.
- All rooms are air-conditioned and have a small refrigerator.
- Rooms will be cleaned, beds made and towels changed daily.
- Floor lounges provide televisions and comfortable seating to relax and socialize.
- Computers are available for use on the first floor.
- Laundry facilities and vending are provided on the lower level. Ice machines are provided on the first floor.
- All facility areas are smoke-free, including guest rooms. Smoking, including e-cigarettes, is not allowed within 25 feet of any University building or on dining terraces.
- No parking is available at the residence halls. Please refer to your program registration materials for information regarding parking arrangements.
- All guests must follow <u>Housing policy</u> and campus policies.

Bathrooms: Guest rooms do not have private bathrooms, so two shared bathrooms are located on each floor. Men and women will be assigned to separate bathrooms. We recommend that all guests bring a bathrobe, slippers/flip-flops and a case to carry personal items.

Desk Services: Sellery Hall is staffed with 24-hour desk service at the main entrance. Guests receiving calls should instruct family and friends to call 608-262-1076 during the conference. Messages will be placed in mailboxes near the hall desk since guest rooms do not have telephones. Irons, ironing boards and recreational equipment are available for check-out on a first-come, first-served basis. Please return after each use, so other guests may use these items.

IF MEAL PLAN IN GORDON:

Meals/Rates: The Gordon Avenue Market, located in the Gordon Dining & Event Center, will serve breakfast beginning at 6:30 a.m. daily. The rate for double occupancy is \$38.64/night per person and single occupancy is \$61.14/night per person. Rates include breakfast. Please bring the meal ticket issued at check-in to every breakfast. *Payment must be made in full at the time of reservation*. *University Housing accepts American Express, Discover, MasterCard, and VISA*.

Reservations: To make a reservation with University Housing, please complete the <u>online reservation</u> form. Reservations for residence hall accommodations are due by Tuesday, June 25, 2019.

Cancellations: Refunds less a \$35 processing fee will be made through Wednesday, July 3, 2019 (11:59 p.m. CST). No refunds will be issued after this date.

Parking: Residence halls do not have adjacent parking lots. Please refer to your program registration materials for information regarding parking arrangements. Please contact University Transportation Services at 608-262-8683 or wisitorparking@fpm.wisc.edu prior to your arrival to reserve campus parking.
